

Valley View Elementary School opened in 1952 with six classrooms at a cost of \$70,000. In 1958, four additional classrooms were added for \$31,500. A new gymnasium was

added in 1973 at \$25,000. In 1989 four classrooms were added for \$250,000, and four more again in 1998 for \$390,000. The kitchen and cafeteria were renovated in 2006 for \$250,869. The last addition to Valley View was another used portable relocated in 2007 from Ocoee Middle School for \$60,000 and is now being utilized as a computer lab.
